Under the leadership of our Parent Teacher Guild (PTG), we are off to a record start with fundraising this year!

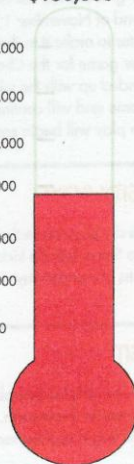

FOOTBALL



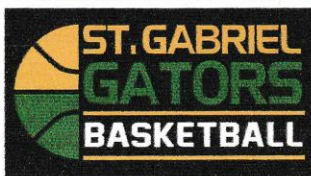
